

### Why are you motivated to join the HFA Board or Nominating Committee? 150 words maximum

As coordinator for the clinical science section (CSS) I believe I can contribute positively to the HFA and the HFA community. The committees and working groups are a backbone of the HFA. Not only are consensus documents crafted in these groups, but ideas and input to the Board for other activities often originate from the committees. I have significant experience from my work in the Board and on the advanced HF committee to take on the role as coordinator of the CSS which I can hopefully further develop. An area where the committees and working groups may improve is greater involvement of volunteers not (currently) represented in the groups. I believe it is important to engage the next generation of HF specialists and volunteers from all HFA regions in the groups. Promoting that would be one important aim for me, should I be offered the role as coordinator.

# How will you combine your HFA position with your daily clinical/research workload? 80 words maximum

I currently hold a position with 50 % clinical work (HF) and 50 % dedicated to research and related activities. That leaves sufficient flexibility for me to take on the task as coordinator for the CSS and to dedicate the time required to work in the HFA Board executive committee. At the same time, I would step down as chair of the advanced HF committee.
