



Prof. Tomas LAPINSKAS, Lithuania

Prof. Tomas Lapinskas is a **Professor of Cardiology at the Department of Cardiology, Medical Academy, Lithuanian University of Health Sciences**, and a practicing cardiologist with specialized expertise in non-invasive cardiovascular imaging, particularly cardiovascular magnetic resonance (CMR). He also serves as the **Director for Public Health, Research, and Education at the Hospital of the Lithuanian University of Health Sciences Kauno klinikos** – the largest healthcare provider in the Baltic region – where he oversees strategic development, research, and large-scale infrastructural projects.

Prof. Lapinskas completed advanced cardiovascular imaging fellowships at several leading European centers, including the University of Gent (Belgium), University Medical Center Rotterdam (The Netherlands), University Hospital of Vienna (Austria), and the German Heart Center Berlin (Germany). He later served as a senior researcher at the German Heart Center Berlin's MRI-Core-Lab from 2016 to 2018. In 2018–2019, he pursued further specialization in advanced heart failure at the University of Zurich, where he remains an active alumnus.

His scientific focus includes **novel imaging biomarkers, cardiotoxicity**, and the integration **of AI-driven innovations** in cardiovascular care. As principal investigator, he leads collaborative research initiatives with international industry partners such as Siemens Healthineers and directs research exploring the clinical utility of **telemedicine, wearable technologies**, and **digital health solutions**.

Prof. Lapinskas is also the **Course Director of the Leadership Academy at Kauno klinikos**, fostering professional growth and leadership among healthcare specialists. He is a frequently invited speaker at national and international scientific conferences and has been serving as **President of the Lithuanian Society of Cardiology** since 2023.
