Heart Failure Doesn't Stop Us – IAHFN's 2025 Awareness Campaign

The Irish Association of Heart Failure Nurses (IAHFN), a special interest group of the Irish Nurses Cardiovascular Association (INCA). In a demonstration of national leadership, creativity, and commitment to improving public awareness, we initiated a country-wide Heart Failure Awareness strategic initiaitve in 2025 under the theme of "Heart Failure Doesn't Stop Us."

With 160 dedicated heart failure nurses across 57 hospital and community sites in the Republic of Ireland, we united with purpose and passion. This strategic initiative aimed to foster engagement, innovation, and collaboration among multidisciplinary teams across Ireland. The response was exceptional, reflecting the dedication of Heart Failure Nurses to raising awareness within their communities

Partnering for Impact

To amplify our message, IAHFN partnered with key national organisations including the Irish Heart Foundation, Croí, and the Health Service Executive (HSE) Communications Department. At the heart of our campaign was John Ridge, our inspirational patient champion, who bravely shared his story of living well with heart failure.

John's journey was promoted through radio, social media, and print media, reaching audiences across the country. Now an active voice with Heart & Stroke Voice Ireland, John continues to inspire countless patients with hope and positivity.

Nationwide Nurse-Led Action

In a show of creativity and commitment, we launched a country-wide Heart Failure Awareness Day (HFAD) competition, encouraging participation from teams across Ireland. The response was incredible. Activities included:

- Public awareness talks and webinars
- Interactive hospital and community information stands
- Staff education sessions and heart health guizzes
- Blood pressure and lifestyle checks, "salt stations," and more

Nurses also shared photos and stories from their local campaigns, helping to celebrate the vital work of heart failure teams across the country.

Patients at the Heart

We also featured patient exemplars who embody the spirit of the campaign—living full lives despite heart failure. With permission, we proudly included their photos in action to show the real faces of resilience and hope.

Collaborating Beyond Hospitals

This Heart Failure Awareness Week, Emer Burke, Heart Failure Advanced Nurse Practitioner, Galway University Hospital, and President of the Irish Association of Heart Failure Nurses, reminds us that 'Heart Failure Doesn't Stop Us' and shares three things to know if you live with heart failure.

- 1.A diagnosis of heart failure does not need to stop you living your life. Despite its challenges, many individuals find ways to live active and fulfilling lives, thanks to advancements in treatments and therapies with the help of specialist supports that are more accessible than ever.
- 2.1t is important to know the symptoms of heart failure, which include breathlessness, sudden weight gain, leg swelling and fatigue. You need to monitor your symptoms daily and notify your healthcare team of any new or worsening symptoms, without delay.
- 3. Medications and lifestyle changes are key. Ensure you are taking your medicines correctly, incorporate physical activity into your daily routine and try to reduce the amount of salt and salty foods in your diet. Do not smoke, reduce alcohol and keep up to date with your vaccinations to stay well.

Heart failure may challenge you, but it need not stop you from living a good life.





Political Engagement



The Irish Association of Heart Failure Nurses (IAHFN) is currently establishing strategic partnerships with leading Irish heart charities Croí and the Irish Heart Foundation, as well as the patient representative group Heart & Stroke Voice Ireland. This collaboration aims to strengthen advocacy efforts to enhance the prevention, early detection, and treatment of heart failure, while also calling for greater support for patients across the country.

Together, we will engage with Irish policymakers to push for the development and implementation of a new national cardiovascular health strategy, replacing the previous strategy which lapsed in 2019. The IAHFN is committed to working with all relevant stakeholders to ensure that the voices and needs of heart failure patients are placed at the heart of this policy renewal process.

In line with this commitment, the IAHFN fully supports Croí and Heart & Stroke Voice Ireland's policy document, *The Future of Cardiovascular Health in Ireland – A Manifesto for Change*, and will actively contribute to advancing its recommendations.

Central to our campaign this year was the patient story and our patient champion John Ridge generously shared his story of how heart failure does not stop him.
