2. General Curriculum Vitae (300 words maximum)

I graduated from Ege University Faculty of Medicine in 2006, and I was accepted to the cardiology residency programme in the Dr Siyami Ersek Thoracic and Cardiovascular Surgery Training and Research Hospital by coming 44th among 20.000 medical doctors in September 2007. Completing residency in 2013, I have been recognized as a cardiology specialist, and I have been working in the same referral centre since 2016. (2013-2016: Governship duty)

Since the very beginning, I always had the aspiration to become an interventional cardiologist with an academic background, and I tried my best to build my career on these enthusiasms.

My areas of expertise are coronary and peripheral endovascular interventions, structural heart diseases and interventions, stroke prevention in atrial fibrillation (left atrial appendage closure). I have been accepted to the observership program in the Section of Invasive and Interventional Cardiology, Heart and Vascular Institute (Miller Family) of Cleveland Clinic where I had the opportunity to work under the supervision of Dr Samir Kapadia and Dr Mehdi Shishehbor in 2017. I have been appointed as the Chair of Turkish Society of Cardiology (TSC) Young Executive Committee in 2018 and also elected as the Fellow of European Society of Cardiology (FESC) in 2019.



I have more than 35 scientific papers, including original articles and case reports in peer-reviewed journals and making oral and poster presentations both in national and international meetings. Also, I have been accepted to the Junior Reviewer Programme of the European Heart Journal – Case Reports in 2019, and I am regularly reviewing case reports under the supervision of Dr Marco de Carlo.

I have fulfilled the required standards (scientific background) for qualifying as an 'Associate Professor of Cardiology' and waiting for the application period that will be open at the end of June 2020.

Apart from cardiology, I do snowboarding and play tennis regularly. Also, I do dubbing and play snooker as a hobby.
