




European Journal of Cardiovascular Nursing (EJCN) - The voice of nurses and allied professionals

ESC Clinical Practice Guidelines

ACNAP has actively contributed to ESC joint position papers and ESC Clinical Practice Guidelines, including those on CVD during pregnancy, atrial fibrillation, hypertension and prevention of cardiovascular disease.

Injectable Therapies

ACNAP has carried out the first survey to measure the use of injectable therapies. The project “Patient and healthcare professionals’ perspectives on use of injectable medicines among patients with cardiovascular conditions”, will be applied to explore the current facilitators and barriers to injectables in CVD from the perspective of patients, caregivers and HCPs. Through the survey and focus groups, we can develop and test the feasibility and acceptance of material on injectable therapies for CVD patients. Outcome results and scientific papers will be published in 2020.
