Career overview	<p>Harleah Graham Buck, PhD, RN, FPCN, FAHA, FAAN is the Sally Mathis Hartwig Professor in Gerontological Nursing at the University of Iowa where she is also the Director of the Csomay Center for Gerontological Excellence. Dr Buck has over 30 years' experience in cardiovascular nursing along the trajectory from prevention to hospice care. She is an active member of the American Heart Association where she serves as current Vice-Chair of the Awards Committee for the Council on Cardiovascular and Stroke Nursing (CVSN). She also serves on the Geriatric Cardiology Section Palliative Care Work Group of the American College of Cardiology. Dr Buck is on the editorial boards of Circulation: Cardiovascular Quality and Outcomes, the Journal of Cardiovascular Nursing and the Journal of Gerontological Nursing. Her funded program of research focuses on heart failure patient and informal caregiver dyads using non-pharmacologic interventions to improve treatment adherence. Her expertise in chronic illness management, human behaviour, and mixed methodology contributes substantively to innovative, transdisciplinary initiatives</p>
