The major drivers



- Long term unaffordability of present models of delivery
- Mismatch between aspirations of individuals in receipt of care and providers
- Non health determinants of wellbeing becoming more recognized
- Aspiration to shift from activity to value through personalized capitated population health outcomes
- Workforce pressures

Inevitable effects of these changes



- Increased pressure on clinicians delivering care
- Doing more with less in less time ...
- Managing increasing multimorbidity
- Administrative burden reporting
- Regulation and "assurance"
- Less than optimal deployment of EMRs
- Expecting more management of clinical risk
