**I trained in Medicine, Intensive Care and Interventional Cardiology at the Department of Cardiology, University of Tübingen, Germany. Early in my professional career, my research focused primarily on Excimer Laser Angioplasty and I lead the European Excimer Laser Angioplasty Registry. Other topics of interest included Local Drug Delivery and Multiple Slice Coronary CT. I completed my Habilitation in 1998 and received an honorary Professorship from Tübingen in 2004.**

**I moved to Bristol, UK in 2000 and worked on the development and implementation of the Bristol interventional service leading to the creation of the Bristol Heart Institute in 2008. I assumed the Clinical Leadership for Cardiology from 2005-2008, and subsequently took the lead for Cardiac Research from 2009. I was awarded an honorary Professorship from the University of Bristol in 2014.**

**My clinical practice comprises the full spectrum of coronary interventions with a focus on acute coronary syndromes, structural aortic and mitral interventions and recently renal denervation. We developed a broad research portfolio with a focus on devices and acute coronary syndromes.**

**I have served on the board of the British Cardiovascular Intervention Society (BCIS) where I chaired the Education and Training Committee. As a member of the Working Group 10, I was part of EAPCI from the very beginning and have served on the board as Chair and Co-Chair of the EAPCI Web and Communication Committee and now as EAPCI secretary. I am a board member of EuroPCR and Co-Director of Gulf-PCR. My keen interest in improving education and training in Europe is reflected in my membership of the PCR Educational Solutions Research Group (ESRG).**
