2. General Curriculum Vitae (300 words max)

Dr. Gaemperli studied medicine in Zurich and graduated from Zurich University in 2003. After a 2 years' training in internal medicine and a 4 year clinical training in Cardiology at the University Heart Center Zurich (Prof. Lüscher) he obtained Swiss board certification in 2010. In 2005 Dr. Gaemperli joined the cardiac imaging team at the University Heart Center Zurich (under Prof. Kaufmann) where he extensively trained in cardiac CT, SPECT and PET, and published many original research articles. From 2009-2010 he completed a 2-year research fellowship at the MRC Cyclotron Unit Hammersmith Hospital London UK (under Prof. P. Camici). Upon return to Zurich, Dr. Gaemperli was trained in interventional cardiology and assumed a shared staff position between interventional cardiology and cardiac imaging. His main research interests include cardiac multimodality and hybrid imaging, imaging approaches to vulnerable plaques and novel imaging techniques. With more than 100 published original articles, and many review articles and book chapters Dr. Gaemperli is a recognized researcher in the field of cardiac multimodality imaging, and probably one of the few who has practical experience with almost all noninvasive and invasive modalities (echo, Nuclear, CT, and invasive angiography with FFR, IVUS and OCT). His many extracurricular activities include associate editor of the European Heart Journal, editorial board member of three other journals, Program committee member of EuroPCR and ICNC, and member of the ESC CPG (Clinical Practice Guideline) committee. Furthermore, he is a member of the EAPCI, and Nucleus member of the EACVI section of Nuc/CT.
