In 2007, the number of members of our working group increased to 265. Due to the increasing exposure of the working groups by the ESC, using flyers and webpages, it is expected that the number of members will further increase the coming years. The working group joined the bi-annual meeting of the European Society of atherosclerosis and shared the organisation of a session at that meeting. In addition we profiled ourselves at the exhibition where flyers and folders were distributed concerning activities of the ESC and our working group. The working group operates low profile which can be explained by the fact that within Europe larger organisational structures are operating in the research field of Atherosclerosis. The coming year we will increase visibility of the working group within and outside the ESC. For this purpose we have now created the positions of "Internal communication" and "external communication" within our WG. The working group will actively search for collaboration and active interaction platforms with other European organisation active in our field of research. In addition, we will more actively visualize our ambitions within the ESC. Already at present two of our past members have been elected as members of the ESC board. Main purpose of this increased interaction will be to increase the visibility of our working group and highlight the advantages of the embedding into a large scientific community as the ESC.

During the nucleus meetings in February 2008 and September 2008, the members have been asked to take responsibility in this communicative effort. Therefore, communication tasks have been defined and nucleus members appointed to deal with these communication issues. We have also been successful in appointing a web manager.

In 2009, it is our goal to become more active at the website of the ESC and newsletters will be spread by mail and by the ESC webpages. We will be more actively profiling the value and opportunities of the WG and the ESC at national and international meetings. In 2008-2009 two meetings will be supported: the meeting of the Turkish society of Atherosclerosis and the EuroEcjo meeting in Lyon.
